


Smoking mushrooms?? Nope! The smoke is really **thousands of spores** leaving "home" to attack unsuspecting plants.

Blobs of fungus, called corn smut, are often found on ears of corn. Some people like to eat it. Yum!





Inside the brightly colored spots on these apple leaves are tiny spores that, when released, infect juniper plants causing these **gooey** orange tentacles to form.
