# C. Plant Health 2022 Updates (Tressa/Megan)

## Registration:

- 260 registered to date
- \$135,242 revenue
- 18 Early Career PLUS
- Presenter registration deadline is June 10, which will drive an increase in reg numbers by that date.

### New this Year:

- 3 hotel options/ 1 being family friendly
- Accessibility page
- Quiet Room, nursing room
- Networking opportunities in PH Hub
- Limited touch points and providing safe environment, checkpoints for Covid. Health and Safety details outlined on the meeting website.
  - Negative PCR test requested now, suggested this be an antigen test.

**ACTION:** change requirement to be negative antigen COVID-19 test.

### D. Publications (Krishna/Greg)

#### 1. APS Journals

Charge from Council to engage two composition vendors to produce APS journals.

## **Current status:**

- Since February, all APS Journals are now published in their issue months
- PhytoFrontiers and Phytobiomes Journal are both being produced by a new composition vendor (Aptara)
  - Issue 2 of Phytobiomes Journal is in composition with KGL.
- MPMI is now with Aptara too, beginning with its August 2022 issue.
  - June and July issues are in composition with KGL.

Want to ensure issues are all good before moving the other two journals to Aptara.

- Phytopathology and Plant Health Progress will be moving to Aptara too.
- Phytopathology with its October 2022 issue.

• Plant Health Progress with its Q4 2022 issue.

Adding a second (new) vendor - TNQ

- Plant Disease will likely be moved to TNQ with its November issue.
- TNQ has **Proof Central**, a robust intuitive author interface that is purported to have faster turnaround times.
  - o 40% of manuscripts are returned in 24 hours
  - o 60% in 48 hours
- TNQ only provides a third-party invoicing solution for page fees.

## 2. MPMI EIC Appointment

Due to Covid, Jeanne Harris extended her EIC term and had been searching for a replacement. IS-MPMI Board has already approved the appointment and it was forwarded to APS Publications Board, who approved it as well. Next step is for APS Council to approve.

**RECEIVED** recommendation from the IS-MPMI Board and the APS Publications Board to appoint Tim Friesen as Editor-in-Chief to *MPMI* for 3-year term beginning January 2023.

**MOTION:** to approve the recommended appointment of Tim Friesen as MPMI Editor-in-Chief for a three-year term beginning January 1, 2023. *Seconded; motion passed.*
