

Early detection difficult- initial symptoms subtle and easily confused with other problems




Outer bark Phloem Wood



# TCD in black walnut (*Juglans nigra*) has been in West for a long time


- Disease first formally described in eastern Colorado 2009
- However, epidemic in black walnut probably started in Oregon, Utah, western Colorado in late 1980's






### Progression of TCD


- Epidemic slowing in Boulder
- Most remaining trees < 25 cm diameter</li>





## Will TCD develop similarly in native range of black walnut?

- Tennessee (6 counties) 2011
- Virginia 2011
- Philadelphia 2011
- North Carolina 2012
- Ohio (beetle trapped) 2012



## We can slow down, but not stop spread of walnut twig beetle

- Logs can be infested for up to 20 months!
- Prevent movement of wood with bark attached
  - Firewood
  - Logs for woodworking
- Quarantines?
  - State quarantines
- Log treatments




23,040 Beetles/2 logs

#### Surviving Black Walnuts in Colorado

- Escapes?
  - Most surviving trees < 25 cm diameter
- Sanitation?
  - Boulder has an aggressive program
- Biological control?
  - Predators identified
- Induced resistance?




## Variation in susceptibility to *G.* morbida in black walnut genotypes





#### Use of insecticides on high value trees

- No experimental evidence to support use yet
  - Experiments underway in Colorado and Tennessee
    - Imidacloprid (Merit)
    - clothianidin (Arena)
    - emamectin
- Anecdotal evidence from arborists
- Black walnut considered 'nut' tree, limiting the types of insecticides that can be used



Walnut treated with Merit insecticide


### Summary
