

- Electronic survey of all Pacific Division members conducted from 9/16/15 to 10/9/15
- 121 people responded; 18% response rate.
- Respondents rated networking opportunities as the most important factor for creating a positive meeting experiment. Opportunities for graduate students and the scientific program (special sessions) were rated the second and third most important factors.
- These factors were especially important for members that attend most regularly.
- Overall, and across all attendance levels, respondents indicated they were more likely to participate in a field tour than a statistical workshop or professional development activities.
- Between the two workshop offerings, there was a slight preference for a workshop on experiment design/power analysis vs. an introduction to R.
- The majority of respondent s (74%) favored the current practice of holding a joint meeting when the APS annual meeting is held in the Pacific Division. Further, at least 50% of respondents in all attendance groups except "N/A" also supported this structure.
- There was strong support (92%) for raising annual membership dues. Again, at least 50% of respondents in all attendance groups supported raising dues.
- The plurality of respondents (29%) expressed interest in hosting the next meeting in California. A venue in Oregon was second (16.5% of respondents). Washington was third (8.3%).
