ABSTRACTS ARE DUE BY DECEMBER 6, 2013

There will be no extensions beyond this date!

Additional abstract requirements: At least one author of each paper presented at the meeting must be an APS member. Only abstracts of those papers actually presented at the meeting will be published and only unpublished information may be included.

Fifteen minutes will be allowed for each oral paper, 12 minutes for presentation and 3 minutes for questions. Equipment will be available for digital presentations (PowerPoint) via LCD. Bring your presentation in PowerPoint (PC compatible) on a USB memory stick. Abstracts not conforming to the required style will be returned to the author and must be resubmitted on or before the December 6 deadline for acceptance. Only those abstracts accepted and presented at the meeting will be published online by APS. Authors are responsible for grammatical editing. have your abstract proofread by a colleague.

PAYMENT FOR ABSTRACTS

Abstract fees are \$45 if paid by the deadline (December 6, 2013), and \$55 if paid at the meeting. Payments for abstracts should be made online when registering for the meeting or, if after the deadline, sent directly to the SDAPS secretary/treasurer, NOT to APS. Send payment form (page 6) plus check made payable to "APS" or "APS/SD" (with the notation "SDAPS abstract payment") to Gary Vallad, Dept. Plant Pathology, Gulf Coast Research and Education Center, 14625 CR 672, Wimauma, FL 33598. Please use the invoice on page 6 so that payments can be matched with abstracts.

Do NOT send purchase orders or direct vouchers. RECEIPTS for abstracts will be available at the meeting, but they cannot be mailed in advance.

SDAPS GRADUATE STUDENT RESEARCH AWARD

Eligible graduate students are invited to enter the Graduate Student Research Award Competition. Up to three awards may be presented. Awards

for the first, second, and third place speakers are \$300, \$200, and \$100, respectively.

Congratulations to the 2013 winners, Rebecca Melanson (Louisiana State University), Philip Vines (Mississippi State University), and Abraham Fulmer (University of Georgia), who placed $1^{\rm st}$, $2^{\rm nd}$, and $3^{\rm rd}$, respectively.

Eligibility Requirement: Students competing for the award must i) be enrolled in a graduate program in the Southern Division either at the time of, or within six months prior to, the abstract submission deadline (**December 6, 2013**); ii) have paid dues to the Southern Division at the time the paper is presented; iii) be sole or senior author of the paper; and iv) present this paper at the meeting of the SDAPS. The paper must communicate results of research in plant pathology conducted while in pursuit of a degree at a Southern Division college or university.

SDAPS GRAD STUDENT / Post Doc Travel Award

Graduate Students and Post-doctoral Associates who plan to present a paper at the Southern Division meeting in Birmingham are encouraged to apply for the Southern Division Travel Award. The Executive Committee of SDAPS has approved up to five awards of \$300 each. Graduate students and post-doctoral researchers who are members of the Southern Division of the Phytopathological Society are eligible to compete for a Travel Award to present their research at the SDAPS meeting. Applicants competing for the Travel Award must i) be enrolled in a graduate program in the Southern Division or a postdoctoral research associate at an institution in the Southern Division at the time of, or within six months prior to, the abstract submission deadline, ii) be a member in good standing of the Southern Division at the time of the meeting, iii) submit the application form and a cover letter documenting the need for a Travel Award (described below), and iv) request that their major advisor or PI supervisor submit a letter of support. Graduate students competing in the graduate student paper competition are eligible for a Travel Award. Applications are due **December 6, 2012.**

The application will consist of the application form (pg. 5), a narrative statement of no more than 500 words describing the student's academic interests and career goals, current academic status (including courses taken), and involvement in professional activities. Descriptions of innovative projects and/or research that the student has conducted or participated in should also be included. The applicant should state how participation in the meeting will lead toward achievement of professional goals. An abstract of the presentation must also be submitted as well as a confidential letter of recommendation from the student's graduate advisor must also be submitted. The application must be submitted as a single PDF file containing the SDAPS application form, the narrative statement described above, and a copy of the abstract to be presented.

Applications are available on page 5 and should be sent to **Nicole Ward Gauthier at nicole.ward@uky.edu.** Recipients will be contacted by the Vice President prior to the meeting. Awards will be presented at the 2014 SDAPS business meeting.

Nominations for the Outstanding Plant Pathologist Award and the Donald M. Ferrin Service Award

The Outstanding Plant Pathologist Award is granted to a member of the American Phytopathological Society-Southern Division in recognition of distinguished contributions to plant pathology. The contributions may be in research, teaching, extension, or any other aspect of plant pathology in either an academic or non-academic setting. The award will consist of a plaque and a monetary gift (\$400).

The Donald M. Ferrin Memorial Service Award is granted to a member of the Southern Division of the American Phytopathological Society in recognition of distinguished service to the American Phytopathological Society. Any Southern Division member who has served for the American Phytopathological Society at the national or divisional level and made outstanding contributions to the advancement of the society's mission is eligible for nomination.

for either Nominations award must accompanied by a statement - no longer than 3 to 4 pages, double-spaced - giving name, position, affiliation, and critique that includes the nature, scope and relevance of the contributions that qualify the nominee for consideration. biographical sketch of the candidate not exceeding 1,000 words should accompany the nomination. The application will consist of a narrative statement of no more than 500 words describing the student's academic interests and career goals, current academic status (including courses taken), and involvement in professional activities. Descriptions of innovative projects and/or research that the student has conducted or participated in should also be included. The applicant should state how participation in the meeting will lead toward achievement of professional goals. An abstract of the presentation must also be submitted as well as a confidential letter of recommendation from the student's graduate advisor must also be submitted.

Applicants competing for the Travel Grant must i) be enrolled in a graduate program in the Southern Division or a post-doctoral research associate at an institution in the Southern Division at the time of the abstract submission deadline or within six months prior to the abstract submission deadline, ii) be a member in good standing of the Southern Division at the time of the meeting, iii) submit the application as a single PDF file containing this SD-APS application form, the narrative statement described above, and a copy of the abstract to be presented, and iv) request their major advisor or PI supervisor to submit a letter of support. Graduate students competing in the graduate student paper competition are eligible for a Travel Grant.
