GENERAL PUBLICATION POLICIES

At least one author must be a member of The American Phytopathological Society, except that any subscribing institution outside the United States or Canada may have published, by a staff member, one paper (in English) per volume. A letter of transmittal, signed by an official of the foreign institution, should accompany such manuscripts.

Submission of manuscripts: Submit all new manuscripts to The American Phytopathological Society, Editorial Office, 1821 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minn. 55104. Do not submit new manuscripts to the Editor-in-Chief. Submission implies nonsubmission elsewhere and (if accepted) no publication elsewhere in the same form without consent.

Subject matter should fall into the following categories:

1) Original research on some phase of plant disease.

2) Review papers developing a new concept, hypothesis, theory, or other integration of plant pathology.

3) Phytopathological Notes: These are accounts of techniques, original research, or phytopathological history of general importance, but sufficiently brief (1-4 typed pages) as not to exceed 2 published pages. The editors will endeavor to publish notes as soon as possible after acceptance.

Page Charge: A charge of \$40 per published page will apply to all manuscripts submitted by authors except those submitted in response to invitation by the Society.

Separates: No free copies supplied. Reprints will be available at a nominal cost; quotation will be sent with proof.

For style details, follow: Author's Guide for Manuscript Preparation, Phytopathology 61:1-3, 1971, and Style Manual for Biological Journals (second edition). Amer. Inst. Biol. Sci., Washington, D.C., 117 p. Authors are urged to have one or more colleagues read the manuscript critically prior to submission.
